Louis Tseng is an Assistant Director at **Georgia State University (GSU)**, in the Instructional Innovation & Technology, Network Engineering Division. He specializes in strategic management as well as performance management in large organization. He manages 4.2 million annual department budget and directly impact over 73.6 million capital improvement budget. He is also responsible for department regulatory compliance while overseeing the day to day operations of the university. His goal is to develop the organization and mentor staff's growth to achieve GSU overall vision.

Prior to his transition to his current role at GSU in 2015, Louis was a Lead Enterprise Architect at **Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport**, in the Information Services Division. He specializes in airport strategic management as well as IT performance management. As a Lead Enterprise Architect in the new international terminal system design, Louis successfully implemented all IT systems at Maynard H. Jackson Jr. International Terminal (MHJIT) in 2012. The budget cost of the project was 1.3 billion US dollars.

In 2008, Mr. Tseng joined the **International Air Transport Association (IATA)** Radio-frequency identification (RFID) Baggage Working Group and become a committee member. In 2009, he was honored and selected as an evaluation committee board member by IATA to represent Atlanta International airport in IATA's worldwide RFID Bag Tag request for proposal (RFP). He played an instrumental role in evaluating the proposal from vendors worldwide and providing the final recommendation to IATA.

Additionally Louis has been an active member of the **American Association of Airport Executives (AAAE)** since 2006. In 2007 he became the first Asian-American in the Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport 82 years history to become a certified member of the American Association of Airport Executives by passing an exam that includes a very broad aviation knowledge base. The knowledge base includes Airport Management, Finance and Administration, Airport Operation Security and Maintenance, Legislative Affairs, Marketing and Communication, Planning Construction and Environmental and Air Service Development.

Furthermore, Louis has a strong heart to serve his community. He took a huge step into the political arena. He ran in the Municipal Election for City Council in 2013 for **City of Duluth GA**. In 2015, he completed the **FBI Citizens Academy** program. In 2017, he again completed the **Leadership Gwinnett** program. Currently, he is the Commissioner of **Duluth Public Art Commission** and an active board member of **Gwinnett County Coleman Middle School Advisory Board**. One of his visions is to improve the City efficiency and services to the citizen by utilizing the information technology to measure and improve the City.
